II. Treasurer's Report	Terry reported: Prevention/Education - \$2,752.93 Treatment/Intervention - \$5,394.93 Criminal Justice Services - \$274.94 Discretionary - \$454.27 Current Balance - \$8,878.07 Total User Fees collected in 2016 (as of Oct. 31, 2016) - \$33,091.74	Deb motioned that the report be approved. Brett seconded.
III. Coordinator Report	22.25 hours worked in October with Board and ICJI. All grantees should receive funds with award letter this week. Anyone denied should get letter of non-funding. ICJI awarded Southern Hills \$18,100 for training and drug screens from unspent state-wide LCC funds. Southern Hills asked for \$140,000 to provide community training (though not the same training as Southern Hills requested). Our website is being updated, it was approximately 18 months out of date. Our Bylaws have been approved, effective immediately. We will have elections for Executive Council in January. Let Janet know if you are interested in running for a position (officer or representative).	
IV. Representative Reports	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nancy shared that Jeremy Lee gave a presentation about Active Shooter at a Chamber lunch and learn. Very powerful information presented. She thanked him for his presentation. Janet asked if SAC should go to JPD for a field trip. Nancy said that it would be a good idea. • Brett said Southern Hills is preparing for a substance abuse education for minors. This is a closed training, required by probation department, schools and/or parents. • No other representatives were present. 	
V. Other	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Layne shared that there is a crisis intervention training, law enforcement can register free. He brought flyers. • Jeremy Lee said "Tall Cop Says Stop" was 2 presentations, during day for law enforcement and evening open to community. About 50 law 	

	<p>enforcement officers participated and 31 participated in the evening. Next time, he'll offer free food and expand it to more professionals, possibly during teacher in-service day. Presentations were well received. Tall Cop is booked through all of 2017.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Joyce thanked SAC for the medication collections, which was also promoted through IN Community Action Agency's statewide newsletter. She believes 350 pounds were collected. • Forest Park is hosting a mental health first aid training to anyone working with youth at Cedar Crest Intermediate School, Nov. 17 from 8-5pm. Contact Audrey for more information. She doesn't think Certification is offered. • Heather shared that Memorial hired a new Nurse Practitioner for medication management. • Natosha Beckman shared that there was a 3-day child/teen brain training. Many people who have substance abuse people also suffered childhood trauma, as defined by ACES. Joan Knies offers basic training on understanding ACES. Southern Hills and Memorial offer a more in-depth assessment and treatment for those who are learning to cope with trauma.
